It All Started With One Baby

The 20th anniversary of the Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla Maternity Home is right around the corner! As we look forward to celebrating 20 years, we are filled with gratitude for the many beautiful mothers and children we've had the privilege of serving over the years.

Faithful board member Bryan Grabanski, of happy memory, said that even if one baby were born here . . . one baby saved from abortion . . . then all of our work and efforts would be worth it.

Bryan died just months after holding that one baby—the first born at Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla Maternity Home. That precious little one's name was Geianna Emilee Faith. Today, she is 18 years old and preparing to graduate from high school.

Geianna first arrived at Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla Maternity Home in her mother's womb, along with her 1-year-old sister, Kassity. Here, Geianna's mom found the support she needed until it was time to give birth.

However, she struggled with addiction and mental illness. So when Geianna was in fifth grade, she and Kassity came to live full-time at Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla Maternity Home. Director Mary Pat Jahner served as a mother figure to them as they grew up.

Geianna loved the warm, joyful atmosphere of her new home. She worked, played, and prayed

alongside all the moms, children, and staff. As she's grown over the years, she's helped with meals and household chores, celebrated birthdays and holidays, and attended Mass with us every Sunday in our beautiful chapel.

"Saint Gianna and Pietro's Home is our home," Geianna says. "It's nice because we went from having no family to this giant, big family with open arms ready to help you. Mary Pat has always taken care of me. I've always wanted to be here, even when I was little. It's that good."

Geianna's friends frequently visit the house and love it almost as much as she does.

"Geianna has brought joy and hope since her birth and because of circumstances has always been a part of us here at Saint Gianna and Pietro's—like a daughter to me," Mary Pat says.

Now, Geianna plans to go to school to become a radiology technician after graduating.

"Mary Pat is trying to help 24/7 in any way possible," Geianna says. "I thank her for the person I am today."

In many respects, Geianna's life embodies this ministry of life that you make possible. It is in this community that she has grown and found joy, for (almost) twenty years. From Heartbreak to Hope: A Mother's Redemption Story

Everyone at the Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla Maternity Home knows the beautiful face of baby Brooklynn Marie. You do, too: She was our Giving Hearts baby this year. Today, we are privileged to share with you the story of her mom, Rozalyn—a beautiful story of strength and conversion.

Rozalyn had a painful childhood. As a child, she suffered abuse. After her father died, the family split up and Rozalyn was placed in foster care. When she was 13, a family adopted her. Although they were supportive, Rozalyn was too hurt and hardened by her past to accept their love. At the age of 16, she started using drugs.

Rozalyn's struggle with addiction continued for many years. In the meantime, she was in and out of jail and had five children, none of whom ended up living with her. By the time Rozalyn was pregnant with her sixth child, she was sleeping in a car.

Alone and at the end of her rope, Rozalyn had no intention of keeping the baby after she gave birth. She planned to put her daughter up for adoption, or even just leave her at the hospital.

But when little Brooklynn Marie finally arrived, Rozalyn's heart melted.

"The more I saw my baby, the more I realized I couldn't leave her," Rozalyn says. "I told the nurse I would stay."

Rozalyn needed a safe place to go with Brooklynn. Since her own adoptive parents were already caring for three of her children, Rozalyn decided to seek help at the Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla Maternity Home.

"It was time to sober up and be the mom my kids deserved," Rozalyn says. "Mary Pat called me and asked me if I really want to be a part of the family, and I said yes."

It turned out to be a life-changing decision.



In her six months at the Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla Maternity Home, Rozalyn experienced tremendous healing. She completed drug treatment and began mental health counseling. She started renewing her relationships with her other children. She came back to the Church, frequently attending daily Mass in our chapel.

In February, Rozalyn knew it was time to find a place of her own. With the help of the Maternity Home, her adoptive parents, and others in the community, she moved to Grand Forks. She was able to use donated household items from the Maternity Home to set up her new place.

As Rozalyn continues her journey to healing, she is providing a beautiful life for little Brooklynn. And she still keeps in touch with Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla Maternity Home.

Director Mary Pat Jahner says, "We miss her and Brooklynn very much, but are also very proud of her and see in her clearly what God can do when we want to change our ways and accept His love and Mercy."

Your generosity, especially in our recent Giving Hearts campaign, provides a second chance for mothers like Rozalyn. We hope and pray that there are many more stories of redemption and healing to come!





A Courageous Yes to Life

It's so important to let young mothers like Molly and Mariana know that they're not alone—and that they have what it takes to choose life. Your support provides them with encouragement and a loving community on their journey to motherhood.

We are so grateful for Molly and Mariana's courageous witness to the Gospel of Life. They trusted in God's words: "For I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope" (Jer 29:11).

Inspirations From My Parents' Holy Matrimony

Gianna Emanuela shares what we can learn from her parents, Saint Gianna and Pietro Molla, about a holy marriage.

There are many aspects of my parents' marriage that profoundly enlighten me and move me. These include their deep faith and unwavering confidence in Divine Providence; their deep humility (I think humility is the indispensable virtue to become a saint—the indispensable virtue for all other virtues); and their infinite mutual love, which made them more serene and stronger.

I am also deeply touched by their immeasurable love for us, the children, and their family; their great mutual esteem; their reciprocal continuous communication and support; their intense and constant prayers of gratitude to the Lord and the Virgin Mary; and their love and charity towards their neighbors.

They truly lived the Sacrament of Marriage as a vocation and as a path towards holiness.



My Saint Mom was the first person who recognized the holiness of my Dad and followed his example. This is clear in the letters she wrote to him. Some examples:

On September 13, 1955, about a week before their wedding, she wrote to him: *“Dearest Pietro, I’m sure that you will always make me as happy as I am now and that the Lord will listen to your prayers, coming from a heart that has always loved Him and served Him in a saintly way. Pietro, how much I have to learn from you! You are such a fine example for me, and I thank you for it.”*

And on February 22, 1958, during their married life, she wrote to him: *“As I have told you other times, your faith and your piety are a great example to me: I want to learn to pray as you do, dear Pietro.”*

After my Dad's death, on the 3rd of April 2010, on Holy Saturday, at the age of almost 98, with a lucid mind till the very last day of his long life, more and more people — Cardinals, Bishops, Priests, consecrated persons, including cloistered nuns, and laity — from different parts of the world, told me personally or wrote to me that the Lord blessed me with two “*saint parents*”, that my parents are two “*saint spouses*”, and that they pray to them and ask for their intercession.


